

# Canine AFP Protein, Ultra Low Endotoxin

## Description

<b>Source</b>	Recombinant Canine AFP Protein is expressed from HEK293 with His tag at the C-Terminus. It contains Arg19-Val609.
<b>Accession</b>	Q8MJU5
<b>Molecular Weight</b>	The protein has a predicted MW of 67.71 kDa. Due to glycosylation, the protein migrates to 68-70 kDa based on Bis-Tris PAGE result.
<b>Endotoxin</b>	Less than 0.01 EU per µg by the LAL method.
<b>Purity</b>	> 95% as determined by Bis-Tris PAGE > 95% as determined by HPLC

## Formulation and Storage

<b>Formulation</b>	Lyophilized from 0.22µm filtered solution in PBS (pH 7.4). Normally 8% trehalose is added as protectant before lyophilization.
<b>Reconstitution</b>	Dissolve the lyophilized protein in distilled water. Please refer to the Certificate of Analysis for detailed instructions.
<b>Storage</b>	-20 to -80°C for 12 months as supplied from date of receipt. -80°C for 3 months after reconstitution. Recommend to aliquot the protein into smaller quantities for optimal storage. Please minimize freeze-thaw cycles.

## Background

Alpha-fetoprotein is a shuttle protein that delivers nutrients through receptor-mediated endocytosis to embryonic cells. In adults, alpha-fetoprotein can shuttle drugs into alpha-fetoprotein receptor-positive myeloid-derived suppressor, regenerating and also cancer cells. Drugs with high-binding affinity to alpha-fetoprotein can activate or deplete targeted cells. Myeloid-derived suppressor cells activation leads to immune suppression that can be used for treating autoimmune diseases.

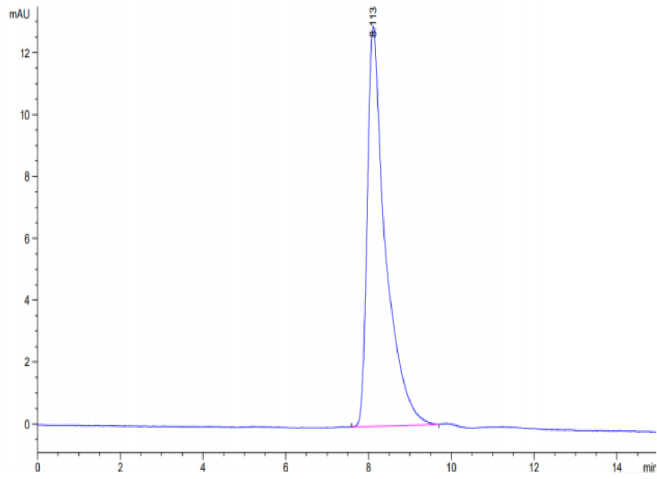
### Bis-Tris PAGE
